All students completing an undergraduate education degree must meet the following conditions in order to graduate and be recommended for graduation or certification:

- Complete an oral communications class, English composition I & II, and a required math class or its equivalent with grades C or better
- Complete the specific pre-education, subject area, and education courses with a C grade or higher
- Attain a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.75
- Attain a subject-area grade point average of at least 2.5 (applies to middle school, secondary, and K-12 programs)
- Gain acceptance into the School of Education Professional Program (consult with your academic advisor)
- Submit acceptable results from a Missouri FBI background check
- Passed each section of the College Basic Academic Subjects Exam (CBASE) with scores of 235 or higher
- Passed the appropriate Praxis II exam
