- Take the Major Field exam.
- Pass the WEPT test.
- Pass 300/400 level Writing Intensive Course.
- Maintain 2.00 cumulative GPA.
- Complete 120 units.
- Complete Senior Recital & turn in program for verification.
- Meet Constitutional requirement—Pass American History 101 or 102 or Political Science 210.
- Complete 36 upper division (300-400 level) units.
- Meet residency requirement (Final 30 hours at UMKC).
- Successfully complete of all degree requirements.
