Admission to this program is in two phases, first into pre-nursing, then by application and Committee approval into the Accelerated program. Your path to graduation may vary slightly based on factors such as college credit you earned while in high school, transfer work from other institutions of higher learning and placement in Mathematics. You are responsible of checking prerequisites to any courses.
