

Four-Year Graduation Plan - Courses and Critical Benchmarks



The following is a sample course of study. It is the Student's responsibility to ensure that all program requirements are met. This guide is not a substitute for academic advisement. **All incoming freshmen must develop an academic plan (which maps out all courses needed to graduate within your intended major/degree). Your academic advisor is available to meet with you and create your specific plan.**

Your path to graduation may vary slightly based on factors such as college credit you earned while in high school, transfer work from other institutions of higher learning and placement in Mathematics. You are responsible for checking prerequisites to any courses. Critical Courses and minimum recommended grades (as noted below) provide feedback regarding major fit and help indicate likelihood of successful completion of chosen academic program and degree.

Program Description

The Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures offers a major program of study leading to a bachelor of arts degree in Foreign Languages and Literatures, with an emphasis in either Spanish, French or German. 36 hours, at or above the 200 level, are required for completion of the Spanish major. These 36 hours include 30 hours of emphasis in Spanish, and 6 hours of Breadth requirement.

- < 30 hours of Emphasis in Spanish:
 - o Two Spanish 200-level courses or higher 06 cr. and
 - o Spanish 315, 325, and 415 09 cr. and
 - o Two 300-level Spanish courses or higher 06 cr. and
 - o Two 400-level Spanish courses 06 cr. and
 - o Spanish 499 (Capstone) 03 cr.
- < 6 hours of Breadth Requirement, which may be met with:
 - o A second Foreign Language Emphasis;

- A minor in another foreign language offered by the Department;
- Six (6) credit hours of coursework at the 200-level or higher among foreign language courses outside the Emphasis (including courses taught in English). These classes must focus on language, literary or cultural studies. Appropriate courses offered by other departments (e.g. History of Latin America) can fulfill the breadth requirement with the prior approval of the UG advisor.

Undergraduate minors are offered in French, German, German Studies and Spanish. 18 hours of Spanish are required for completion of the minor.

Graduate programs of study leading to a master of arts degree in Romance Languages are offered with an emphasis in either Spanish or French.

Career Opportunities

Aside from pursuing teaching careers, holders of degrees in foreign languages are in demand by government, the media and international business in growing numbers, as the need for increased sophistication and expertise in international affairs continues to expand. Multinational companies and organizations now view foreign language skills as an asset in a prospective employee. In the past 10 years this notion has become widespread in such areas as business, industry, commerce, civil service, education, law, communications media and health services. The changing conditions of international economics, politics and communications indicate that this trend will continue.
