

Four Year Graduation Plan – Courses & Critical Benchmarks:

The following is a sample course of study. It is the Student's responsibility to ensure that all program requirements are met. This guide is not a substitute for academic advisement. For more information see the University Catalog at umkc.edu/catalog.

Your path to graduation may vary based on factors such as college credit you earned while in high school, transfer work from other institutions of higher learning, and placement in Mathematics. You are responsible for checking prerequisites to any courses. Critical Courses and minimum recommended grades (as noted below) provide feedback regarding major fit and help indicate likelihood of successful completion of chosen academic program and degree.

Please Note: Architectural Studies is a 5-year partnership program with Kansas State University in Manhattan, KS leading to a Master of Architecture, Master of Interior Architecture/Product Design or a Master of Landscape Architecture. Architecture and Interior Architecture students complete years 1-2 at UMKC, and then years 3-5 at K-State. Landscape Architecture students spend year 1 at UMKC, and years 2-5 at K-State. Eligible students can receive in-state tuition at both UMKC & K-State, contact the department for details.

Students who do not place into MATH 110 Precalculus Algebra or MATH 116 Math for Liberal Arts may have to complete preparatory math coursework, potentially adding 3 hours to the total hours required for the degree.
