#### Four Year Graduation Plan - Courses & Critical Benchmarks:

Your path to graduation may vary based on factors such as college credit you earned while in high school, transfer work from other institutions of higher learning, and placement in Mathematics. You are responsible for checking prerequisites to any courses. Critical Courses and minimum recommended grades (as noted below) provide feedback regarding major fit and help indicate likelihood of successful completion of chosen academic program and degree.

**Please Note:** Students who do not place into MATH 110 College Algebra or higher may have to complete preparatory math coursework, potentially adding 3 hours to the total hours required for the degree.

The following coursework must be completed prior to applying to the BSN Clinical Program: HLSC 101, NURSE 101, LS-MCRB 112, CHEM 115 + 115L OR CHEM 211 + 211L, HLSC 120, MATH 110, and NURSE 160.

#### Other Information

A minimum of 30 hours must be earned at the University of Missouri-Kansas City, regardless of the number and level of hours earned at another institution. Undergraduate degree-seeking students are required to earn credit in at least 36 hours of coursework numbered 300 and above at UMKC. In the case of transfer credit, the coursework must be numbered as junior-senior level work by the transferring institution. Community-college transfer coursework cannot count towards the 36-hour requirement.

#### **Policy**

The University reserves the right to make changes in courses and course schedules without notice. Students are expected to maintain a quality of achievement significantly above minimum UMKC standards for degree work. Individual student progress will be monitored throughout the program. Satisfactory progress is required of all students for retention in the program. Students are expected to maintain academic standards, perform satisfactorily in courses, refrain from academic dishonesty, comply with the established University and teacher education timetables and requirements, and refrain from unethical or unprofessional behavior or behaviors that obstruct the training process or threaten the welfare of the student or others. Other circumstances involving student behavior will be addressed by the faculty on an individual basis.

All students completing an undergraduate degree must meet the following conditions in order to graduate and be recommended for graduation or certification:

- Students must maintain a minimum semester GPA of 2.75 and no course grade can be less than a B-.
- Students must keep a current copy of all immunization on file in the Nursing Student Services Office.
- All students must complete a Criminal Background Check & a Mental Health Background Check.

#### **Program Description & Admission Requirements**

The UMKC School of Nursing & Health Studies mission is to prepare the nursing and other health professional workforce as leaders in improving health outcomes through inter-professional practice, research, and education; excel in the delivery and improvement of health care to diverse populations including urban, rural, and under-served areas; and create diverse and dynamic campus and virtual learning communities.

**First Time College Students:** Admission to UMKC is all that is required for students applying for pre-nursing. High school students applying to UMKC for the first time, graduating in the upper 10% of their class with a minimum ACT score of 27, will be guaranteed admission to the clinical major in the sophomore year if all of the pre-requisite courses below are successfully completed (no C- or below grades and 2.750 minimum GPA) the freshman year.

- Criteria for Progression in Pre-Nursing and Eligibility to Apply to the Pre-Licensure BSN Clinical Program:
- Students must achieve a minimum grade of C in all required general education, science, and nursing courses (and maintain a minimum 2.750 semester and cumulative GPA) in order to continue progression in the pre-nursing program and be eligible to apply for and be admitted to the pre-licensure BSN nursing major. A grade of less than C (C-, D+, D, F and Withdraw Failing (WF) or Audit (AT) is not satisfactory for progression.
- Satisfactory completion of all pre-requisite courses (no C- grades or lower and a minimum 2.750 nursing GPA, although a 3.500 cumulative or higher GPA is highly recommended), 36 hours minimum suggested, including all core science courses by the end of the Spring semester prior to entering the nursing major in the fall. Completed courses must include:
- Chemistry w/lab, Microbiology (no lab required), Anatomy & Physiology with lab, College Algebra, NURSE 101 Intro to Nursing (at UMKC) and HLSC 101 Intro to Health Sciences (at UMKC, HLSC 101 waived if student has either A&S 101 or 60+ transfer credit hours and a 3.5+ cumulative GPA).
